It is not the same as phonics, which involves knowing how written letters relate to spoken sounds. Activities that develop phonological awareness in children provide practice with rhyme and with beginning sounds and syllables. What is Phonological Awareness? - Super Duper Phonological awareness skills are important in order to develop good reading skills. Having good phonological awareness skills means that a child is able to manipulate sounds and words, or "play" with sounds and words. The Definition of Phonological Awareness - Only Half the ... Phonological Awareness (PA) is the foundation upon which the other reading skills are built. Simply stated, the definition of phonological awareness "is the ability to notice the sound structure in words." (Kilpatrick, 2015) When students don't master PA, it can adversely affect their progress in the other essential reading components.
